Important Notice for Parents/Carers

St Joseph's PS aims to be a Nut-Free school. In order to reduce the risk to those children and adults who may suffer an anaphylactic reaction if exposed to nuts to which they are sensitive, necessary measures must be put in place. The school aims to protect children who have allergies to nuts yet also help them, as they grow up, to take responsibility as to what foods they can eat and to be aware of where they may be put at risk.

We no longer allow nuts or nut products in school lunch boxes. Being a 'Nut-Free School' means that the following items should not be brought into school:

- Packets of nuts
- Peanut butter sandwiches/bars
- Fruit and cereal bars that contain nuts
- Chocolate bars or sweets that contain nuts

- Sesame seed rolls (children allergic to nuts may also have a severe reaction to sesame)
- Cakes made with nuts
- Nutella spread or Nutella breakfast bars

If you are unsure about an item, please speak to a member of staff. Parents and carers are reminded that they must notify staff of any known or suspected allergy to nuts and provide all medical and necessary information. This will be added to the child's care plan.

School App





Breakfast Club

Road Safety and Car Parking
